





Telecoms are an important component of Mexico's structural reforms



Government Roles for the Telecommunications Reform

Executive branch: Deployment of specific Telecoms and DTV projects

Legislative branch: Laws and resources for the Reform

Judicial branch: Specialized courts; no suspension on IFTs resolutions

Federal Telecommunications Institute (*IFT*)

- Constitutional body
- Regulatory authority
- Budget Autonomy
- Competition Law
 Enforcement Powers
