PLENO DEL INSTITUTO FEDERAL DE TELECOMUNICACIONES PRESENTE

Informe que presenta el Comisionado Ramiro Camacho Castillo respecto a su participación en representación del Instituto Federal de Telecomunicaciones en el "Foro Anual de Telecomunicaciones y Medios de América Latina y el Caribe", que se llevó a cabo en Miami, Florida, Estados Unidos de América, del 14 al 16 de mayo de 2023, organizado por el Instituto Internacional de Comunicaciones (IIC).

El Foro Anual de Telecomunicaciones y Medios de América Latina y el Caribe (*Annual LatAm & Caribbean Telecommunications & Media Forum*) es un foro que se realiza año con año con el objetivo de reunir a diversos reguladores de la región, creadores de políticas públicas, industria y sociedad civil para discutir los desafíos y oportunidades del sector. El Instituto Federal de Telecomunicaciones es miembro del IIC desde 2015 y participa activamente en estos eventos de manera anual.

En esta ocasión, se realizaron diversos debates para compartir experiencias entre los distintos interlocutores respecto de las oportunidades y desafíos que existen para cerrar las brechas digitales, así como sobre los retos que representa la transformación digital. El lunes 15 de mayo, como parte del Foro Regional de Reguladores (RRF), participé en la sesión "*Closing the digital divide – what's really working, what isn't, and how to make sustainable progress*", en la que se abordaron principalmente los siguientes temas:

- Regulación inteligente para la era digital: ¿Qué se requiere para adaptarse a los rápidos cambios del ecosistema digital?
- Colaboración y cooperación -intersectorial, interinstitucional e internacional;
- Experiencias de los países invitados sobre la reducción de la brecha digital de cobertura y políticas públicas que se han implementado para favorecer su reducción.

En esta sesión mencioné las acciones que ha estado realizado el Instituto Federal de Telecomunicaciones (IFT) desde los ámbitos de política del espectro, infraestructura y fomento a la competencia económica que han contribuido en la reducción de las brechas digitales. Algunos de los temas que abordé fueron: 1. Política para el despliegue de infraestructura; 2. Experiencia con la regulación asimétrica impuesta al preponderante en telecomunicaciones;

3. Otorgamientos de concesiones que benefician la reducción de la brecha digital (concesión de Altán, CFE Telecomunicaciones e Internet para todos y CFE Mayorista); 4. Regulación colaborativa que realiza el IFT tanto en el ámbito internacional como en el nacional, destacando la participación activa del Instituto en el CCP.II de la CITEL, en preparación para las conferencias mundiales de radiocomunicaciones de la UIT, así como la participación del Instituto en los comités de competencia de la OCDE. Asimismo, mencioné algunas acciones que llevamos a cabo de manera local sobre regulación colaborativa, particularmente las actividades y objetivos del Comité 5G del IFT.

Posteriormente, tuve la oportunidad de asistir a otras sesiones del foro, en las que pude escuchar diversos comentarios, propuestas y opiniones sobre varios temas que tienen gran relevancia en nuestro sector y que contribuyen a construir una regulación efectiva.

Finalmente, anexo la agenda del foro para una mejor apreciación del evento.
